# GENERAL MANAGER'S ANNUAL REPORT 2022/2023

---

The 2022 competition season was another very successful one for Otago basketball in terms of participation numbers and competition numbers where we once again had a year of significant growth.

Numbers of players and teams in Otago continued to increase, especially in our school teams which increased significantly from 325 teams to 353 (9% increase).

Overall our total number of teams playing basketball in 2022 increased from 523 to 550 (5% increase), and basketball continued to be the highest participation sport across Otago schools.

As we move into the start of the 2023 season, we have seen another huge increase in primary schools basketball with a 20% increase in these teams. This is fantastic for our sport and shows how incredibly popular basketball has become with our youngsters in Otago, however it does also create an increasing challenge for Basketball Otago regarding having enough courts to cater for so many teams, and finding enough referees. We will keep working on good solutions for this.

In representative basketball our Otago teams had a mostly very strong season, with five of our ten Otago representative teams finishing in the top 4 or higher.

Both our 13 Boys and Girls teams finished second in the South Island tournament in Ashburton which was a fantastic result for this age group.

Equally impressive was both the Otago 19 Men's and Women's teams finishing 4th at the 19 Nationals in Christchurch. Our 19 Women's team went very close to scoring a big upset win over Canterbury in their semi-final and were very close to making the national grand-final.

Our Otago Gold Rush Women's team went one step further and in a magnificent run of results they made the grand-final of the Women's national championships in Auckland. Along the way they scored impressive wins over Waikato in the quarter-finals and Canterbury in the semi-finals. Although they couldn't quite get past Auckland in the grand-final, it was a great result for our Otago women's team.

The Otago 17 girls also competed strongly to finish 6th at nationals, and our Otago 23 Men's team finished 7th after very narrowly missing out on the semi-finals.

A huge thank you to all the coaches, managers and other helpers for the Otago rep team programme in 2022. It is a massive task and we are extremely grateful for the passion and support from all those in our basketball community who work so hard to help make that possible.

At NBL level it was incredible to watch the Otago Nuggets late season surge to claim their second NBL title in three years in the play-offs up in Auckland

This is an amazing achievement for the Otago franchise, and huge congratulations go to the players, coach Brent Matehaere, General Manager Angela Ruske, the rest of the Nuggets support crew, and to the Otago Nuggets new franchise owners SEN (Sport Entertainment Network). The success of the Nuggets has a huge positive flow on effect right through the Otago basketball community and we congratulate everyone involved in this outstanding achievement.

On the women's NBL side it was a ground-breaking year for women's basketball in New Zealand with the introduction of the new Taihi Women's National League which was the first ever professional women's league in NZ basketball.

This saw the creation of the new NBL franchise, the Southern Hoiho, representing professional women's basketball for southern NZ. The team was captained by Otago's former NZ Tall Fern Sammy Gallaher, and the Hoiho played hard throughout the opening season. The future evolution of this new women's league will be exciting to watch and will hopefully have a very positive impact on the overall women & girls basketball pathway.

# FINANCE REPORT

## 2022/2023

---

2022 saw a significant increase in total income relative to previous years. Total income in 2022 was \$646,207 compared to \$561,155 in 2021.

This was due mostly to increased income from team entries and a significant increase in grant funding. This was an excellent result, however, alongside the increased income there was significantly increased investment into staff and people costs as basketball in Otago continues to grow and the delivery demands increase.

As a result of these investments into our infrastructure, Basketball Otago recorded a small end of year deficit of \$7,466 for the 2022 financial year. The potential of a small end of year deficit had been discussed by the board at the beginning of the financial year and was deemed to be an acceptable outcome as it was felt that investment into the workforce was necessary and a high priority. Overall Basketball Otago is still in a healthy position financially with total assets of \$270,000 at the time of writing.

# 3X3 TOURNAMENTS

## Basketball New Zealand 3x3 Schick Cup

After the 2021 Schick Cup was cancelled due to COVID, it was great to have this fantastic national 3x3 tournament back on the basketball calendar.

Once again the event was played in Invercargill which made it more accessible for our Otago players and supporters.

There were two men's teams representing Otago (Otago Nuggets and Mid City Magic), and two women's teams (Southern Hoiho and Otago Gold Rush). Mid City Magic performed brilliantly to take the Bronze Medal, and only very narrowly missed out on playing for the championship title. Congratulations to the team of Richie Rodger, Josh Aitcheson, Pafe Momoisea, and Benji Freeman.

The Southern Hoiho got better as the tournament went and they finished strongly in 5th place.

The Otago Gold Rush played superbly for the first half of the tournament to win 7 of their first 8 games before being upset in the quarterfinals, and the Otago Nuggets similarly dominated the early stages of the tournament before an upset loss in the first round of the play-offs.



## Quest 3x3 National Tour

Basketball Otago again hosted one of the Quest 3x3 National Tour Events in partnership with Basketball NZ.

41 teams entered the tournament and it was Magic who took out the men's event with a power packed team of Josh Aitcheson, Pafe Momoisea, Dom Kelman-Poto, and Ben Hall.

The Hotshotz team, stacked full of current and former NZ Tall Ferns, dominated and won the women's event. Congratulations to Sammy Gallaher, Zoe Richards, Olivia O'Neill, and Nicole Ruske.


